

Te Wānanga Whakairo Rākau o Aotearoa: Pōkairua (Diploma)

Introduction

We are now seeking applications for the *Te Wānanga Whakairo Rākau o Aotearoa* (the National Wood Carving School). Applicants must be of Māori descent, be able to demonstrate a competency in Māori art and/or design, and have an ability and willingness to interpret and understand the theory component of this qualification.

To maintain the standard and quality of our graduates, places are strictly limited to **5** students or less per intake.

Applications for these positions close at **5pm, Friday 18 November, 2011**. We will accept signed original hard copies only.

Qualification

Under section 15/k of the New Zealand Maori Arts and Crafts Institute Act (1963), the New Zealand Māori Arts and Crafts Institute has the ability to *'Confer diplomas on or give certificates to any person having special training or qualifications in respect of Maori arts or crafts or Maori culture generally'*.

Successful graduates of *Te Wānanga Whakairo Rākau o Aotearoa* qualification will receive a New Zealand Māori Arts and Crafts Institute Pōkairua (Diploma).

This qualification – including a scholarship for each successful applicant – is solely funded by the New Zealand Māori Arts and Crafts Institute.

This qualification is delivered onsite at Te Puia, Rotorua, New Zealand.

Requirements

- This is a **three**-year fulltime (40 hours per week) qualification. Students are entitled to two study breaks between terms and one Christmas holiday break
- Students are required to arrange their own accommodation requirements
- Applicants must be of Māori descent

- Applications must be made on the form provided by the Institute (attached). The applicant may attach any supporting documentation which they consider will support their application
- It is strongly recommended that students supply a portfolio of drawings and/or images, art or design work to illustrate their previous experience and/or skill level

Process

- Applicants will be assessed on a rank score, based on criteria identified in *Te Wānanga Whakairo Rākau o Aotearoa Application for Enrolment Form*.
- Shortlisted applicants will be contacted and an interview arranged (to be conducted by an NZMACI panel)
- Successful and unsuccessful applicants will be notified in writing

Scholarship and Fees

- All successful applicants will receive a NZMACI scholarship to cover tuition and living costs for the duration of this qualification (these generous scholarships have been granted by the New Zealand Māori Arts and Crafts Institute)
- There are no course fees for this qualification
